Guide to the Official Classification of Bordeaux Wine The most famous classification of of Bordeaux wine took place in 1855, the year of the original Bordeaux wine classification of the Medoc. The 1855 classification only took into consideration 61 different chateaux from the Medoc, with one exception, Chateau Haut Brion from what was then known as Graves before it changed to Pessac Leognan.
